

Daily COVID Symptom Screening for Students

School staff will screen each student and staff member with a daily temperature check prior to entering the building.

Parents should daily screen their child/children prior to coming to school by assessing:

1. Does your student have any of the following symptoms?

- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- Fever of 100.4 degrees F or higher
- Chills or shaking chills
- Muscle aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fatigue
- Congestion or runny nose

If YES, the student will not be admitted into school.

2. Is your student...

- Waiting for a COVID-19 PCR test result
- Diagnosed with COVID-19
- Instructed by any health care provider/ St. Paul's School Nurse to isolate or quarantine?

If YES, the student will not be admitted into school.

3. Did your student have close contact (within 6 feet for a total of 15 minutes or more in a 24 hour period) with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19 or suspected of having COVID-19?

If YES, the student will not be admitted into school.

When answering YES to any of these questions:

- Keep the student home from school - If you have any question of whether you should send your child to school, please text the school nurse Dawn RN, BSN at (410) 960-6755.
- Contact the school and report that your child is sick. Give specific details and description of symptoms. Email your student's teacher, the school nurse nurse@stpaulskingsville.org, the office cehatt@stpaulskingsville.org and abrintnall@stpaulskingsville.org
- Develop an action plan with the School Nurse
- Consider whether your child needs to see a healthcare provider and possible COVID-19 testing. When testing is required, St. Paul's will only accept the PCR test (we do **not** accept the Rapid Test.)

To return to St. Paul's from quarantine:

- The student needs to be cleared by the school nurse
- Provide the proper documentation to the office and school nurse.

If the answer to ALL of the questions above is NO, the student may be admitted into school that day.
